Name of activity	Procedure	Time
<b>Lead-in</b>	Students put 'pins' on the map where they think most people drink tea. (Revision of countries and nationalities in English)	10'
<b>Group making</b>	Students pick pieces of paper and they have to find their groupmates.	5'
<b>Introduction (1)</b>	Every student picks a piece of card and they have to find each other. These will be the groups later on. A <a href="#">Power Point Presentation</a> will be shown with the tasks: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Find your group and guess the topic</li> <li>2. Choose a date</li> <li>3. Choose an event</li> </ol>	15'

	4. Choose a name While checking the answers we are talking about the history of tea.	
<b>Europeana</b>	Introduce the website. How to use it wisely considering copyrights. Filters (1): tea, Magyar Kereskedelmi és Vendéglátóipari Múzeum Filters (2): Hollóházi Porcelánmúzeum, tea	15'
<b>Homework:</b>	Collect material for a poster about tea. (eg: teabags, empty tea boxes, Europeana resources ...etc) Think of a possible poster layout.	5'
<b>Sensing</b>	Students smell and taste a variety of different tea flavors with their eyes closed. They have to guess the flavors.	25'
<b>Introduction (2)</b>	Smartboard exercise: Flashcards are shown with tea related vocabulary. There is a picture on one side and the English word on the other side. Picture dictionary: students get the pictures from the smartboard exercise and they label them with the new words learnt.	10'
<b>Game</b>	Find the objects: Each group gets a picture. The teacher tells words from the new vocabulary and students have to circle them on the picture.	5'
<b>Mind mapping</b>	We use Popplet to create a mind map about the making of tea.	10'
<b>Poster making (group work)</b>	In groups students create an A3 size poster where they collect all the information they learnt about tea.	35'
<b>Assessment (Individual work)</b>	In the IT room every student creates a word cloud. They have to use all the words and expressions they can remember.	20'

**Assessment**

At the end of the project, students have to make a word cloud. They have to use as many new words and information as they can.

**Student feedback**

At the end of the project I asked the students what they thought of the different tasks and how they felt during the lessons.

The students enjoyed the tasks. Some of them liked the group making methods but most of them enjoyed the tasting task and poster making the most. I chose unusual flavors, like caramel, herb tea, black tea with milk, wild cherry. Their favourite was Roiboos Orange. Most groups could work together quite well. There was one group where one group member (the only boy) was mainly left out of the tasks.

### Teacher's remarks

*When I started to plan the project, I read a few books about the history of tea. It was a great help to the first lesson.*

*Although I wanted to create a smart board exercise, the licence for the board expired and I haven't got a new one yet, so I had to rethink this task. Finally it was a [PPT](#) but it worked well.*

*Tea tasting was an interesting experience. There were students who were willing to try whatever came, while others were too scared.*

*During poster making, it was very useful that I set a timer on the board so the groups knew how much time they had. After finishing them I put every poster on the board and asked their opinions about them. Luckily they liked each other's posters.*

*During the assessment the students realized how many words they had learnt and it didn't cause any trouble to successfully create a word art.*
