Name of activity	Procedure	Time
Vocabulary building	We open the 24 windows of the advent calendar . Each of them covers a Christmas related picture. With the help of these students create their own picture dictionaries.	20'
group making	With the help of a group making tool students can see the names of their groupmates. They only have to find each other. They form 3 groups.	5'
picture description / vocabulary practice	While one group is trying to solve a puzzle on the smartboard, the other groups have to solve a Trimino puzzle in groups. (Downloadable Trimino can be found in the annex)	20'
Card creation	I sent the Padlet link to students which contained all the pictures downloaded from Europeana. These were the basis of the Gifs. They had to choose one and use giphy.com to customize it. Then they had to send its link to their parents with a nice message.	45'

Assessment

Trimino is a kind of assessment for vocabulary. Otherwise there is no assessment in this LS. This is just for fun.

Student feedback

The GIF making task (Christmas cards) was so successful that many other classes wanted to make it and our principal liked the results and sent some of them as holiday greetings on behalf of the whole school.

Parents sent back messages and they also liked what they children created.

When my students left the IT room they told me how much they liked the task and how much fun it was. Some of them even thanked me that I showed them how to make a gif.

Teacher's remarks

When opening the calendar, we have to take into consideration, that the calendar doesn't let us open future dates. We did this task on the 17th December and couldn't open the 18th. I had to use the [editable version](#) for the rest of the dates.

Jigsaw puzzles can cause some trouble with timing. Some groups didn't do too well on this task. They could solve it but they needed more time than planned.

Because of the young age of students, they didn't really have this kind of IT experience. A lot of personal help was needed even with logging in to giphy.com. They've never copied and pasted links before but finally everybody successfully completed the tasks.
