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Integration into the curriculum

Linked into Adult Education courses in Citizenship - Moral Openness: Tolerance and Diversity / Intercultural Mediation

Aim of the lesson

- Students will reflect about Europeana exhibitions: People on the Move / Faces of Migration;
- Will explore an inclusive approach with participatory photography and digital narratives:
 - Promoting visual creativity;
 - Encouraging more self-confidence in the process of taking pictures;
 - Understanding how to express feeling through photos;
 - Learning how to use personal images as a basis for short narratives;
 - Gaining more self-confidence in sharing personal stories;
 - Creation of a digital storytelling.

Outcome of the lesson

Students will produce a photographic exhibition

Trends

Collaborative learning: a strong focus on group work.

Mobile Learning: working with smartphones.

Peer learning: learning from peers.

21st century skills

Creativity and innovation: students have to take pictures and express feelings through photos;

Collaboration: students will have to work as a team, several times during these lessons.

Communication: students have to present and discuss their work and online resources, more than one time during these lessons,

promoting their communication skills.

Critical Thinking: students will discuss about the work they have done.

1) Presentation and general discussion	Teacher will present to students what is the main idea of the activity.	10
2) Visual brainstorming (reflection & discussion)	Visual brainstorming with Europeana Exhibitions: People on the Move / Faces of Migration. Teacher propose students to create their own exhibition of "Faces of Migration" looking in their families for photographs framed in the topic (individual homework).	30
3) Key concepts (Acquisition & Discussion)	Based in the activity " IncludeUs " done during an Erasmus+ project about migrant's inclusion in Portugal, the teacher will discuss with students the key concepts: participatory photography and digital narratives.	15
4) Teams creation	The teacher asks students to organize in groups to proceed with the activities 5, 6 and 8.	5
5) Challenge - Picture treasure hunt (Discussion, collaborative work)	Based in the activity " IncludeUs " done during an Erasmus+ project about migrant's inclusion in Portugal, students accomplish the Challenge - Picture treasure hunt. The results will be uploaded through Padlet.	50
6) Challenge – Feelings (Discussion, collaborative work)	Based in the activity " IncludeUs " done during an Erasmus+ project about migrant's inclusion in Portugal, students accomplish the Challenge – Feelings. The results will be uploaded through Lino.	50
7) Research and investigation (Collaboration)	The students will present the results of the proposed homework "Faces of Migration" (activity 2). The results will be uploaded through Lino .	20
8) Challenge – The Story Behind My Last Picture (Discussion, collaborative work)	Based in the activity " IncludeUs " done during an Erasmus+ project about migrant's inclusion in Portugal, students accomplish the Challenge – The Story Behind My Last Picture. The results will be uploaded through Lino.	60
9) Photographic exhibition (Discussion, collaborative work)	Students print the photos and organize a photographic exhibition to be presented to the public (school hall).
